Household trash not specifically listed as recyclable will be transferred to an incinerator for disposal.

Recycle for Free

Clean Glass Bottles and Food Jars
Emptied, rinsed, lids and caps removed.

ONLY Plastic In Bottle Shapes with the following symbols:



For Example: Soft Drink, Cooking Oil, Milk Jugs, Shampoo, Motor Oil Containers, Laundry and Cleaning products.

Aluminum beverage and Metal Food Cans Emptied rinsed, labels removed.

NO aerosol cans

NO aluminum foil or food trays

Mixed Metals: Cast iron, aluminum, copper, brass, electrical cords, charging cables, and other metals are recycled. Please consult office about appliances.

Fluorescent Light Bulbs and Ballasts

Household single-use and rechargeable batteries

Printer Cartridges, cell phones, & eyeglasses


Clothing, Shoes & Textiles: recycle in bins if clean & dry. Even single socks, stuffed animals, belts and handbags.

Recycle for Free

Mixed Paper: Magazines, newspapers and inserts, phone books, junk mail, paper tubes, non-corrugated, printed cardboard, envelopes, clean food cartons.



Corrugated Cardboard and Brown paper bags: Dry and flattened. No wax-coated or otherwise lined boxes accepted.



Compost: Drop off your food waste, fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds, leaves and grass clippings. Residents are welcome to take free compost. Tip: freeze it until you dispose. No plastic bags, utensils or k-cups!



Woody Brush less than 5" in diameter is accepted and converted into wood chips. Residents are welcome to take free wood chips.
